



Remember to Submit a Status of Residence Application for Your Newborn Baby!

If a baby has been born into your household in Japan and either of the following conditions applies, you must submit an application to acquire status of residence for your newborn at the Tokyo Regional Immigration Bureau within 30 days of his or her birth date.

- Your baby's nationality is not Japanese
- Your baby will stay in Japan for 60 or more days after birth Apply to the Tokyo Regional Immigration Bureau within 30 days to receive a residence card.

Worried About Your Child? Talk to Ota City's Educational **Consultation Office.**

The Educational Consultation Office is ready to talk to you in person or by telephone about any questions or worries you may have concerning your child. Topics can include your child's education, personality or behavior, developmental disorders, experiences with bullying, and relationships with friends. The office can also talk to you about placing your child in Tsubasa classes.


Issuance of Inhabitant Tax Certificates

Ota City will issue certificates of taxation (or tax exemption) and payment of inhabitant tax (special city inhabitant tax and metropolitan inhabitant tax) for Fiscal Year 2024.

If you were a registered resident of Ota City as of January 1, 2024, and filed a tax return, you are eligible to receive a certificate for the new fiscal year (as proof of income during 2023).

You must present the following to receive a certificate:

- When visiting the service counter in person
- Personal identification (e.g., residence card, etc.)
- When someone representing you visits the service counter
- Letter of Proxy (委任状) (A Japanese translation will also be required if the letter is written in a language other than Japanese.)
- Personal identification of the person representing you


■ Workshop for the "Ehon wo Todokeru Undo" (Campaign to Deliver Picture Books) Program


The participants will then sign the last page of the books in the local language. Anyone with sufficient Japanese language ability to read Japanese picture books is welcome to participate.
