One participant will experience putting on <i>kumadori</i> makeup, one of the most distinctive types of Kabuki makeup, with easy-to-understand instructions. Those in the audience will be able to see the makeup being applied.	A workshop will be held on the music that accompanies Kabuki. It will include shamisen and singing that are performed behind the actors as well as explanations and performances of instruments by <i>ohayashi</i> musicians.

Ota Children's Japanese Class


The Ota Children's Japanese Class is a Japanese language class for children of foreign nationality who do not attend school.

Eligibility Children who meet all of the following requirements (1) to (3).

- (1) Child with non-Japanese nationality who resides in Ota City.
- (2) School-age child who is not yet enrolled in school (born between April 2, 2006, and April 1, 2015) or child who is in a period that begins six months prior to enrollment in elementary school and ends with actual enrollment (born between April 2, 2015, and April 1, 2016).
- (3) Child who lacks Japanese skills and is not enrolled in an Ota City school.

Ota City Has Launched a New Disaster Prevention Portal Site and Disaster Prevention App.

The "Ota-ku Disaster Prevention Portal Site" and "Ota-ku Disaster Prevention App" were launched in July 2021. Both contain useful information concerning disasters and how to prepare for them.

The portal site and app are available in English, Korean, and Chinese (both simplified and traditional characters) in addition to Japanese so that their content can be understood by people of many nationalities.

Ota City residents can use them to find weather information, evacuation announcements, GIS map-based evacuation center maps, various hazard maps, and other useful information in times of disaster.

The site and app also introduce key points for stockpiling necessities at home and preparing for evacuation to help residents be ready before disaster strikes. Prepare for earthquakes, typhoons, and other natural disasters now by familiarizing yourself with Ota-ku Disaster Prevention Portal Site and Disaster Prevention App.

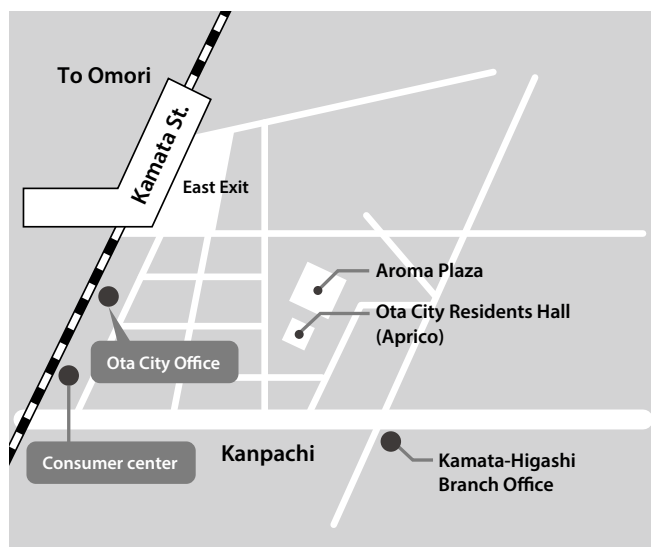
If even one of the following applies to you, please contact us by phone or e-mail first before coming in for your consultation.
