Separate plastics collections are commencing throughout Ota City

Separated collection of plastics, which started in some areas in November 2022, will be implemented in all areas of Ota City from April 1, 2025. Plastics (excluding PET bottles) that are currently collected on Burnable Trash Day and Resource Day will be collected on the newly established Plastic Day. By converting plastic into a resource, we reduce its impact on the environment, including reduction of greenhouse gas emissions.

How to dispose of plastics at collection points

Step 1

Be sure to dispose only of items made entirely of plastic.

Step 2

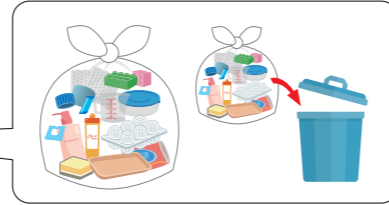
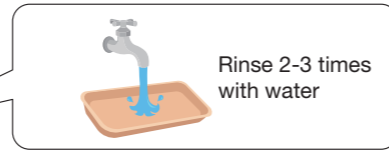
Wherever possible, clean plastics before putting them out.

Dirty plastic items will make nearby clean plastic items dirty too. Plastics usually cannot be recycled if dirty. **Be sure to remove any food scraps, and anything else.**

Step 3

Gather all your plastic items, place them in a transparent (or semi-transparent) bag, and put them out at the collection point **by 8:00 AM on plastics collection day.**

(Containers with lid up to a size of 90 liters are also acceptable)



Please Do not double-bag any items.

All collected bags containing plastics will be opened to check their contents. When disposing of household trash, do not double-bag it (i.e. putting a small bag containing trash into a larger bag). Just put it out as it is.



How to separate and dispose of plastics: Examples (1-11)

1 Plastic bottles

Plastic bottles (no cap or label)

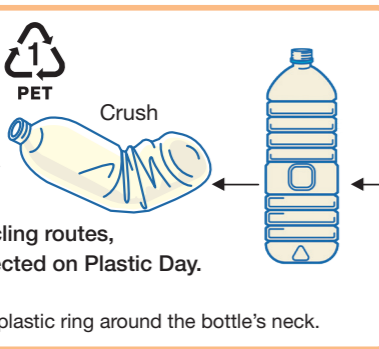


Crush

Collected on "Resource Day"

Due to different recycling routes, these cannot be collected on Plastic Day.

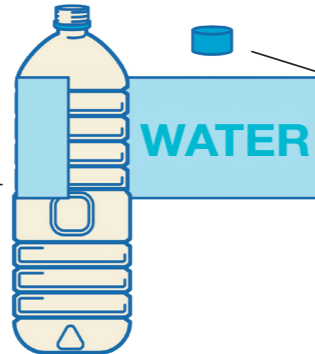
*No need to remove the plastic ring around the bottle's neck.

2 Plastic containers for lunchboxes, cup noodles, etc.

- If any solid scraps remain on the item, you cannot dispose of it as "plastic".
- Rinse 2-3 times with water and remove any solid remnants, etc., then dispose of it as "plastic".
- If only food stains remain, you can dispose of it as "plastic".



Burnable trash



Rinse 2-3 times with water.

You can put it out on Plastic Day.

Solids such as food scraps can be rinsed away with water, after which you can dispose of it as "plastic" despite any remaining stains.

3 Items not marked as plastic

Some plastic products are not marked with the plastic mark. Anything made entirely of plastic is eligible, regardless of whether it has the plastic mark or not.

Spoons, etc.

Cases

Fruit netting

4 Styrofoam, food trays

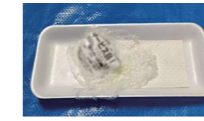
- Styrofoam and food trays, previously disposed of as "resources," should now be disposed of as "plastics".
- Whenever possible, break down large sections of Styrofoam into pieces small enough to fit into a bag.



If you break them down into pieces after placing them in the bag, scraps of Styrofoam will not scatter everywhere. If you are not able to break down the Styrofoam, please put it out for disposal without putting it into a bag

5 Items with paper stickers

If you can peel it off easily, peel it off. If you cannot peel off the sticker, just put it out as "plastic" as it is.



Please dispose of removed paper stickers as "burnable trash"

6 Natto container (if made of foam)

- If you can remove the sticky surface by rinsing with water, you can put it out as "plastics".
- If the sticky surface remains, please dispose of it as "burnable trash".

If left like this, it must be handled as burnable trash



Soak in water for a while.



When you pour off the water, most of the stickiness will be washed away.

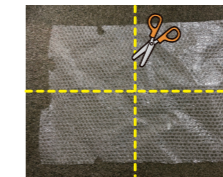


In this state, you can put it out for disposal as plastics.

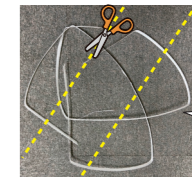
7 Cushioning material, plastic packing string or bands

Cut into approx. 30 cm pieces, and then put it out as "plastic".

*Longer lengths may get entangled in machinery during processing, causing damage.



Cut cushioning material into approx. 30 cm pieces



Please cut bands, strings, etc. into lengths of 30 cm or so

8 CD/DVD, CD/DVD case, etc.

- Both the CD/DVD itself and the CD/DVD case should be put out as plastic.
- Please remove any accessories such as paper.

Paper accessories are recycled as a resource



Please dispose of the CD/DVD itself and its case as plastic

9 Packaging of medicines or snacks (with aluminum finish)

- Items marked with the "plastic" mark can be disposed of as "plastic".
- Items marked only as "metal" should be disposed of as "non-burnable trash".
- Items not marked with any markings should be disposed of as "burnable trash".



It says "metal," but you can put it out as "plastic" because it has the plastic mark



Rinse 2-3 times with water.

Rinse until all waste is washed away.

10 Tube containers (mayonnaise, ketchup, toothpaste, medicines, etc.)

- Once the contents are removed, you can dispose of it as "plastic".
- If you have trouble removing all the contents of tube containers, instead dispose of them as "burnable trash".

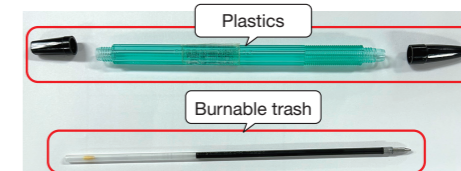
If left like this, it must be handled as burnable trash



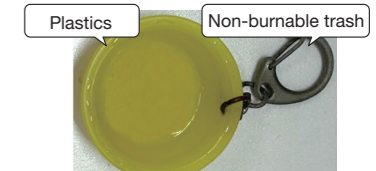
Can be put out as plastic once washed

11 Mixtures with non-plastics

- Plastic parts can be taken apart, then put out as "plastic".
- If the item cannot be taken apart, dispose of it as "burnable trash" or "non-burnable trash," whichever is appropriate.
